# **Pastoral Care**

Our pastoral system provides a school family for every boy at RBAI; our induction programme focuses on the building of firm friendships, opportunities to engage in the extensive co-curricular programme and ensuring each pupil feels he is a valued member of the school community.

# **Supporting Your Son**


Each boy is known and encouraged to develop as an individual. We are proud of our well-established House system, which has an extremely positive impact on all students in their academic engagement, co-curricular participation and development as confident young men and contributors to society.

Every boy is allocated to one of six Houses (Dill, Jones, Larmor, Kelvin, Pirrie and Stevenson), supported by a tutor who will remain with their group until Year 13. Each house represents a family structure with which pupils will quickly identify.

The Vice Principal has overall responsibility for pastoral care. In addition there is a School Counsellor available for pupils. RBAI is an inclusive school with pastoral support for SEND pupils placed on the SEND register when there is an identified, substantial and long-term impairment which has an adverse effect on attainment, learning and

progress. Expectations for all our SEND pupils for whom a grammar school curriculum is appropriate, is that with parental support and regular review, they will flourish in a supportive environment.

If a pupil, on entering the school, has an identified need, the SENCO will liaise with the pupil, parents and, as required, external agencies, to determine how the school can best respond to meeting the pupil's individual needs. The pupil's teachers will be advised about the nature of the identified need and advised as to the support required.



# **PE & Games Provision**

At RBAI we are very proud of our sporting heritage and tradition. Through our values of 'excellence, respect and participation' we seek to develop every pupil's interest in sport and physical activity, irrespective of age or ability.



## Rugby

Year 8 Rugby is a key strength of our induction programme. At RBAI, we aim to foster an enthusiasm for Rugby in an environment where continuous improvement enables players to achieve their highest potential, both individually and collectively.

Highly committed coaches encourage every young player to represent his school on the pitch. Players proudly wear our yellow and black jersey and gain the sense of belonging it provides.

The Schools' Cup, the most prestigious rugby competition in the province, is the highlight of the season. RBAI has reached 59 finals, winning the Cup 34 times and sharing it on 4 occasions. In addition, RBAI has won the Medallion Shield 37 times and shared it twice. Of most recent note are the successes of the 2023-24 1st XV and Medallion Squads who won the Schools' Cup and Medallion Shield respectively, an impressive feat also achieved in 2015, 2016 and 2023. The 2015 Schools' Cup win began a three-year streak which saw the Cup return to College Square East in 2016 and 2017.



Representative records show that more than 360 boys from RBAI have played for Ulster Schools and 49 boys have played for Irish Schools. In addition, 11 boys have played for Ireland Under 19 whilst still at School. A total of 90 boys produced by the School have been capped for Ireland and of the 13 that played for the British and Irish Lions, 2 were captains: Sammy Walker and Robin Thompson.

### Hockey

Hockey is one of the core sports at RBAI and is associated with a long-standing tradition of success throughout Ulster and Ireland. The 1st XI have won the Irish Schoolboy Championships on seven occasions, which is the joint top number of victories throughout all schools on the island. The 1st XI has emerged victorious in the Burney Cup (the Ulster Schools' Cup) on seventeen occasions and are the current holders of this trophy, whilst the McCullough Cup has also been brought back to College Square East on seventeen occasions, making RBAI the most successful 1st XI in the country. The School also has a history of success at U13, U14, U15 and 2nd XI levels, having won the respective Cup competitions on numerous occasions.

A total of 19 former pupils have gone on to represent Ireland and/or Great Britain at Senior International level, with **5 players going on to compete at the Olympic Games.** RBAI Hockey Club currently have 11 pupils playing for Ulster underage teams, with 6 of them also representing Ireland at U16, U18 and U21 level.



### Cricket

Cricket thrives at RBAI; we have won the Ulster Schools'
Cup a record 13 times in the history of the competition.
An excellent example of the Cricket Club's success is the 2024 season when a total of 7 trophies were won. The 1st XI won the Ulster Schools' Cup, with the 2nd XI, Under 14 XI, Under 13XI and Under 12 XI all winning their respective competitions. The school also won the overall McCullough Cup League title, a competition which involves all school cricket teams, from the Under 12 XI right through to the 1st XI. This trophy has been won by the school a remarkable 10 times in the last 11 years. The school has ten Cricket teams, ranging from the Under 12 XI through to the 1st XI, 3 cricket squares as well as a 4 bay, fully-enclosed net system.





### Football

Football has been a sporting option at RBAI since 1978, when a group of 6th form pupils entered themselves into the Northern Ireland Cup without the knowledge of staff. In recent years the RBAI Football Club has gone from strength to strength, regularly reaching the quarter and semi-finals of cup competitions as well as winning the Northern Ireland Plate in 2020, and the Under 18 Belfast League in 2015 and 2022.


The RBAI Football Club is open to boys in Years 12-14 and we have several boys who represent local academies as well as the School teams.

The Club fields an Under 16 team, a Second XI and an Under 18 1st XI. These squads compete in the Northern Ireland Cup, the Belfast Cup and the U18 Belfast League.



### **Badminton**

Badminton is a thriving racquet sport at RBAI. Our facilities provide four courts. There are two clubs for Junior and Senior pupils and boys of all ages regularly represent the school. The Senior team have won the **Ulster and All Ireland U-19 Division 1 Championships** in 2022 and 2023.





### Rowing

Rowing is an Olympic sport which has been popular at RBAI for almost 100 years. As a sport, it demands physicality, technique, rhythm, coordination, timing and teamwork. Our rowers compete all over Ireland and the UK, and enjoy a very unique view of Belfast. RBAI is one of only 4 schools in Northern Ireland to offer the facilities which allow athletes to compete in such an activity. Training takes place every weekday, along with Saturday mornings, at the School and purpose-built boathouse in Stranmillis, South Belfast. In recent years the Club has had representation at Junior International level, with alumni competing at the Under-23 World Championships and Henley Royal Regatta.



### **Swimming**

RBAI has a long and proud history of swimming. Our on-site swimming pool is currently in the process of redevelopment. Teams compete in various schools' competitions with the highlight of every pupil's school swimming career being the Bath Cup Competition held in The Queen Elizabeth Olympic Park, London. It will come as no surprise that the teams achieving our most recent wins in 2015 and 2017 included our 2024 GB Olympic Gold Medallist Jack McMillan.



# RBAI is rich in opportunities for young musicians with more than 200 boys involved in musical activities.

The RBAI Orchestra is also a very large group (between 70 and 80 players) and combines junior and senior pupils. All the music is specially arranged by the Director of Music to cater for different abilities, enabling the younger pupils to perform alongside the older and more experienced ones, and to learn from them. In this way, we find that they develop much more quickly as musicians and as people.

There is also an elite group of jazz specialists whose performance has become one of the highlights in our concert programmes, as well as an array of smaller ensembles including a String Group, Clarinet and Saxophone Quartets and a Show Band.

The boys have the opportunity to perform at the Year 8 Concert in October, the Carol Service, the Drama Production, Open Day and at the Annual Spring Showcase Concert.

All boys may have private tuition on **Woodwind, Brass, String and Percussion instruments,** as well as Theory and Vocal lessons.

# **Performing Arts**

There exists at RBAI a long and proud tradition of staging spectacular and innovative productions.

As a member of The Lyric Theatre's schools' affiliation scheme, pupils of RBAI are provided with opportunities to take part in workshops, trips and performances.



# **Drama**

Each year, Junior school pupils collaborate with Hunterhouse College, Belfast for our annual Summer Showcase in Christchurch, 'Shakespeare & Strawberries'. Pupils enjoy the enriching experience of staging and exploring Shakespeare's famous texts. In the winter term, the Drama Department produce a senior school musical with pupils from Victoria College. This is one of the highlights of the School calendar. In addition to this, the House Drama Competition has become a firm favourite with boys competing for points for their house by performing short, published sketches in front of a panel of judges.

The Drama Department's repertoire of material extends from much loved musicals to gritty dramas. Recent productions include **Blood Brothers** by Willy Russell, Shakespearean tragedies **Romeo and Juliet** and **Antony and Cleopatra** and **A Christmas Carol** by Charles Dickens.

Drama is all inclusive and pupils can contribute on stage as actors, as part of our show band or as backstage crew. Over the years, poets, playwrights and presenters have all tread the boards in the Common Hall and in Christ Church.

The Rugby, Hockey and Cricket Clubs tour respectively to the Republic of Ireland, the UK, Europe and South Africa. The squads train and play a series of matches in preparation for elite fixtures at home. Not only do the squads benefit from the training and match experience, these trips are integral in cementing team dynamic and affording our sportsmen the opportunity to nurture their talent.

### **Combined Cadet Force**

RBAI has hosted a cadet contingent since the time of the Great War.
