




- Continue to encourage your son and praise the effort he makes at home

Work Experience

- Physical or Virtual Work Experience
- Yellow Work Experience Form- Boys have been told to return this by Wednesday 25th
 September. They do not need to have a placement organised by this date.
- 3 Day Work Experience— anytime between Start of October and end of February .
- Once pupil has confirmed work-experience placement they go to allocated member of careers team for school insurance form. This must be signed by employer and returned before allowed out on placement.
- Physical Placement- Once pupil has confirmed work-experience placement they get school insurance form signed by employer and returned to school before allowed out on placement. PREFERRED.
- **Virtual Placement-** Once pupil has confirmed work-experience placement they get consent form signed by parent/guardian and returned to school before allowed out on placement.
