Advice to candidates

- 1. Study the timetable carefully. If you miss an examination through your carelessness you might not be allowed to re-sit it.

 If there are any problems with the timetable see Mr. Waring immediately.
- 2. All School Rules apply during the examination period.
- 3. All exams to take place in the Common Hall (with the exception of Art : Mrs. Martin will inform the relevant pupils of the plan in relation to Art.)
- 4. If you are ill during the examination period, your parent/guardian should inform the school immediately. They should contact the School Office and ask that a message be forwarded to Mr.Waring. Upon your return to school you should see Mr.Waring as soon as possible to re-schedule any exam(s) that you have missed.
- 5. If you have no exam papers scheduled for a particular day you should not come into school on that day.
- 6. Full school uniform must be worn during the entire examination period.
- 7. Throughout the period of the examinations you should arrive into school just before the start of your first exam each day. For example, if your first exam on a particular day starts at 11.15am, you should not be in school before 11.00am. However, be wary of less frequent public transport than at peak times.
- 8. You should go home at the end of your last exam each day.
- 9. Make sure you know the length of each examination. You should not wear a watch of any kind in the Common Hall during an exam. There will be a number of clocks on display throughout the Common Hall. Ensure you have all necessary materials for the examinations such as pens, pencils, ruler, calculators, etc. You will not be allowed to borrow equipment from other pupils in the examination hall.
- 10. Mobile phones to be switched off and left in inside blazer pocket.
- 11. You must remain for the full length of each examination. You will not be allowed to leave early or to use the toilet during an examination.
- 12. No food of any kind is permitted in the examination hall. You may bring a small bottle of water into the hall: it should be a clear, plastic, bottle with no labels on it.
- 13. Lunch is available at the usual time throughout the course of the exam. L6th and U6th should not be in the Dining Hall between 12.55 and 1.30pm during the exams.
 - 14. Do not go to Registration or Assembly throughout the course of the examinations.
 - 15. Any pupil who behaves in an inappropriate manner will be asked to leave the exam hall. The exam paper of that pupil may not be marked as a result.
